1 This crop is suitable for a small garden if compact varieties are grown.

2 In a suitable climate, these crops can be planted more than once a year for continuous harvest.

3 Transplants, shoots, or roots are used for field planting.

If grown in beds, plant two rows per bed. Space the beds about 32 - 40 inches apart and make the tops of the beds 18 inches wide.
