



## City of Fontana Wildflower Plantings Spruce Up Municipal Medians

After meeting with Stover Seed consultants, Superintendent of Public Works, Erik Garwick, decided to reinvent these eyesores. Erik desired an aesthetically-pleasing, ecologically sound, and drought-tolerant combination of greenery and native wildflowers.

Gazania is native to Southern Africa and works very well in Southern California's climate. Gazania was selected for the median beautification project. It is perfect for ground cover, parking strips, borders, wildflower mixtures, slopes and hillsides. It is a perennial that easily spreads, and re-seeds. The areas were prepped, then carefully hydroseeded.

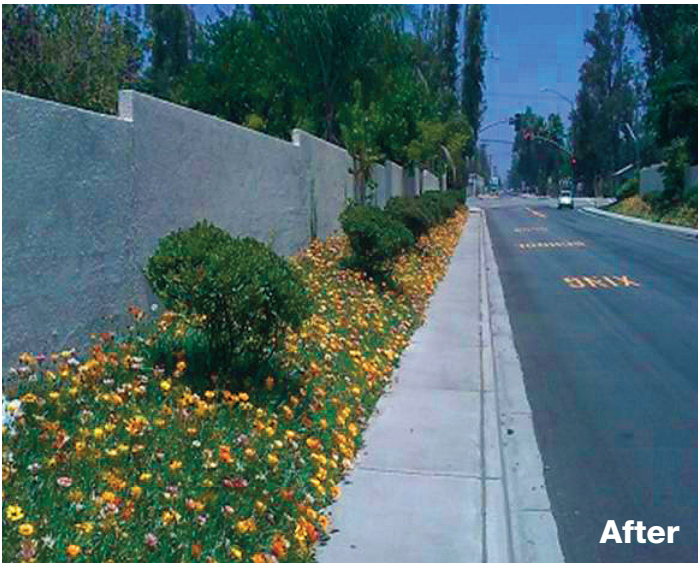
The resulting bloom and shrubbery combinations provide locals and visitors alike with lovely color from Spring into Summer.
