



Grand Slam - GLR Improves Sportsfields at Cal State Long Beach

The Cal State Long Beach soccer and lacrosse fields were experiencing an especially tough problem with Grey Leaf Spot Disease. The groundskeepers had been using a typical rye mixture which had not been resistant to the disease.



Approximately three years ago, after consulting with experts from Stover Seed, head groundsman Brian McKinnon began seeding with Grand Slam – GLR, a Gray Leaf Spot- resistant, perennial ryegrass blend. It
