## Colorful and long-blooming Sweet Pea Multiflora

One of the older flowers in cultivation since the 17th century, the Sweet Pea Multiflora may have begun in England. Two types exist—the bush type and the trailing type. The trailing type needs lattice or something to crawl onto and support the plant. The bush type does not; it will grow to 12-18 inches high.

Sweet Pea Multiflora is very fragrant; it comes in an array of different colors, and is good for cut-flower bouquets. They are a very profuse flowering plant. You can cut them and Sweet Pea Multiflora will last for a long time in a vase.

In a garden setting, they need to be irrigated and protected from wind. They do well in hot and dry climates; but the longest blooms are in cooler months.



The best time to plant Sweet Pea Multiflora is the fall. By early spring, the blooms will last for a couple months. Some will volunteer, but basically you need to replant the Sweet Pea Multiflora year after year.
